BATEC's Collaborative Process of Bringing Industry Voices into Classrooms

Purpose

• To provide industry input and evaluation of the appropriateness and effectiveness of 21st Century skills integration into the curriculum

Benefits

Students:

- Receive timely, up-to-date industry information
- Gain benefit from industry observations and feedback
- Feel motivated to attend class with industry contribution
- Enhance performance and awareness of job skills
- Establish connection to potential internships and jobs

Faculty:

- Receive feedback on course content and validation of teaching outcomes
- Develop and/or deepen relationships with industry partners
- Integrate current industry information into curricular materials to make coursework relevant and authentic

Industry:

- Contribute to a local community and make a difference
- Gain first-hand knowledge of educational practices and challenges in community college classrooms
- Help develop or identify student talent for internships & jobs

Suggested Process for Collaboration: Faculty & Industry

- **§** Share information about academic courses and industry trends (Where are the overlaps?) The gaps?)
- **§** Talk about student learning outcomes for a course and show examples of coursework, projects and/or authentic assessments (21st Century skills)
- § Identify resources and tools to measure and support teaching and learning in the classroom (tasks, projects, rubrics for student performances)
- **§** Structure a time for *at least three* classroom visits to measure the effectiveness of the class activities and authentic assessments on student learning (beginning, middle and end of course)
- **§** Keep regular and open communication between f2f meetings (email, telephone, Skype, etc...)

September	Faculty meeting during the first two weeks of class
Late September	Industry-faculty dinner (course planning)
Before Mid-Semester	First industry visit to classroom (rubrics)
Before End of Semester	Second industry visit to classroom (rubrics)
January 2010	Final evaluation, celebration and wrap up (data and evidence shared)

Sample Time line

Data & Evidence

- Rubrics and performance measures that are authentic (vetted by industry)
- Enhanced curricular materials with industry input
- Student, faculty & industry feedback on skills and performances (pre and post)

Follow-on: Identify ways to build and extend the relationship and collaboration over time:

- Identify potential student talent for internships or jobs
- Invite industry partners to events on interest on campus or in the community
- Continue to share information & resources
