Summary of BATEC Information Technology Workforce Skills Study:

Published in February 2007, two years of information review, polling local IT industry leaders and mapping and comparing results to national trends

Industry Wants: Workers with more than deep technical skills

- Ø Workers with employability (soft skills) defined as:
 - **§ Communication** (oral & written)
 - **§ Work productively in team and groups** (teamwork)
 - **§** Customer and business focus (get the big picture)
 - **§** Listening for meaning and comprehension
 - § Prioritize work and self evaluate (self-reflection & time management)
 - **§ Develop original solutions to novel problems** (problem solving)
 - **§** Lead and act responsibly (leadership and ethics)

Industry leaders told BATEC about the importance of soft skills:

- Ø "Technical skills get you the interview, soft skills get you the job."
- Ø "Technical employees must be able to advance to jobs that require more soft skills."
- Ø "We look for these (soft skills) during the interview –they're absolutely essential to success."
- Ø "The real world is unpredictable –soft skills are how you cope."
- Ø "We assume technical skills –we spend most of our interview time on the 'fit' for our organization."
- Ø "A person who does not fit can ruin the team..."
