




George Boole (1815-1864)

"...no general method for the solution of questions in the theory of probabilities can be established which does not explicitly recognize...those universal laws of thought which are the basis of all reasoning...."










AND narrows a search by retrieving the intersection between topics.

Apples AND oranges would only get those that have both types of fruit.








NOT narrows a search by excluding entire categories of information.

Apples NOT oranges would exclude things that had oranges, even if they also had apples.







OR broadens a search by retrieving either topic. OR is especially important for grouping synonyms.

Apples OR oranges would get anything that had either type of fruit.








Google: Timeline

1840-2011 Search other dates



Google: Wonder Wheel








