

Grant Kickoff Workshop Scheduled

Louisiana Delta Community College and Louisiana Tech University are pleased to announce an upcoming kickoff workshop for Project COMPLETE, which will further advance engineering technology career pathways for high school students in North Louisiana. The July workshop will offer counselors and teachers an opportunity to further enhance their professional development in STEM education research, federal grants, and college partnerships.

This collaboration between Louisiana Delta Community College and Louisiana Tech University is possible because of a grant provided by the National Science Foundation (NSF) Advanced Technological Education Program. The NSF is an organization striving to provide more opportunities across diverse geographic regions for underrepresented groups who may wish to join the STEM workforce.

People are needed that can not only repair and replace instrumentation but also have troubleshooting skills to determine root causes of failures and help drive improved plant reliability."
