- 70% will be the first in their family to graduate from college




## Results



## An Envision Schools graduate:

- 1. Meets the state's minimum standards
- 2. Demonstrates, through a body of evidence and multiple academic measures:

  - b.) Deep content-specific understandings
- 3. Is prepared for the 21st century technology based workplace, success in college, and in life.

## **The Components**

- 1. A student cover letter and introduction to the collection of work;
- 2. A digital arrangement of certified, mastery level student work produced in core content and/or interdisciplinary areas, which is assessed and certified by teachers prior to the presentation;
- 3. Reflective summaries of the work artifacts in the five core content areas;
- 4. Workplace Learning Artifact & Reflection and;
- 5. 21st Century Leadership Skills Assessment


